The Australian Physiotherapy Council normally undertakes an Initial Assessment of a new program in the year prior to the first intake of students. Initial Assessment does not indicate a program has been accredited. A program has been accredited by the Australian Physiotherapy Council when the status is listed as Accreditation for 12 Months, Provisional Accreditation or Full Accreditation

A program is not normally granted Provisional Accreditation or Accreditation for 12 months until the first cohort of students is in the final semester of study. Provisional Accreditation is for a two year period. A program is not normally granted Full Accreditation until the first graduates have been working for around 12 months.
